INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR SECULAR HUMANISTIC JUDAISM

The International Institute for Secular Humanistic Judaism (IISHJ) was established in 1986 to fulfill the need for trained Secular Humanistic Jewish leaders. It is sponsored jointly by the Society for Humanistic Judaism and the Cultural and Secular Jewish Organization. It began offering its Leadership Program in 1986 and its Rabbinic Program in 1992. Its first rabbinic ordination took place in 1999; subsequent ordinations have happened biennially as students complete their programs. The IISHJ began its Officiant Program in 2018. Its Colloquium program began in 1997, drawing together scholars and activists to explore the pressing issues of the secular Jewish world. The founding dean of IISHJ was Rabbi Sherwin T. Wine. Its current Dean is Rabbi Adam Chalom, Ph. D.

[Tmura-IISHJ](#), the Israeli sister organization to IISHJ in North America, began in 2004 and held its first ordination in Jerusalem in 2006; they have likewise continued biennially. Tmura-IISHJ has also sponsored a rabbinic association for its graduates and has recently initiated Secular Humanistic Jewish communities in several locations in Israel. The founding dean of Tmura-IISHJ was Professor Yaakov Malkin, z"l. Its current Dean is Rabbi Sivan Malkin Maas.

The Institute promotes Jewish and Humanistic scholarship by educating those of any religious or philosophical outlook and by training people to become Officiants, Leaders and Rabbis according to the philosophy of Secular Humanistic Judaism.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION/ORDINATION

Leadership and Officiant Program

The certification/ordination process is managed by the Certification Committee of the IISHJ. There is a continuing education requirement to maintain certification. Continued membership in a Secular Humanistic Jewish movement communal organization, either the CSJO or the SHJ, is also required to maintain certification/ordination.

Rabbinic Program

An ordination certificate is provided by the IISHJ and signed by rabbis of the movement and faculty of the IISHJ. Graduates of the Rabbinic Program are contacted by the Association of Humanistic Rabbis (AHR) and invited to become full members of the organization. Continued membership in a communal movement organization, either the CSJO or the SHJ, is required for AHR membership.
